



CAMP MACKINICHOLEA SUMMER STAFF 2019

POSITION: **LIFEGUARD** (2 POSITIONS; 1 male & 1 female)

Supervision and provision of all aquatic activities.

POSITION DATES: June 23 thru August 15

SALARY: \$16.60/hr

IMMEDIATE SUPERVISOR: Directly responsible to the Director and must consult with the Director on all phases of the camp program. Subject to these regulations, the lifeguard has final authority on all waterfront activities.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Inform campers and staff of all rules and regulations of the waterfront at the beginning of each camp
 - a) post rules in dining hall, waterfront and boat launch
 - b) see Policy Handbook for rules and regulations
- Develop procedures for drowning, missing person-searching the water, spinal injuries and procedures for non-lifeguarding staff providing emergency assistance to Head Lifeguard.
- Guard and oversee all waterfront activities from a visible position
- Ensure safety of the swimming area and boat launch'
 - a) anchor the raft at an appropriate depth for diving (8 feet is suggested)
 - b) ensure all waterfront equipment is secured and kept tidy after use
 - c) ensure safety and maintenance of decks
 - d) ensure swimming area is securely marked
- Ensure swim area is equipped with suitable devices to alert all bathers of an emergency situation, as well as accessible throwing assists
- Report all waterfront accidents and procedures taken to the Director
- Ensure all waterfront equipment including piers, floats, platforms and decks, are in safe operating condition; check daily and report repairs to maintenance person
- Ensure swim area is equipped with a spine board for emergency situations; instruct staff in its use
- Ensure a first aid kit is readily available for emergency use
- Develop an effective method for testing the swimming skill levels of campers and staff and record abilities before participation in waterfront programs
- Ensure that emergency equipment on board all watercraft includes an extra paddle or oar and a water bailer
- Ensure all watercraft seek the protection of the nearest shore in the event of a lightning storm, excessive wind strengths or other stormy conditions
- Must inform Director when leaving the campsite
- Read and follow Policy Handbook
- Other duties as designated by the Program Director

SKILLS AND QUALIFICATIONS:

- Minimum of nineteen (19) years of age, and have obtained the following:
 - a) current Lifesaving Society National Lifeguard Service Certificate
 - b) Standard First Aid & CPR C
- A current acceptable Police Intervention Check including the Vulnerable Sector Search and Intervention Record Check from Children and Family Services
